Certification is critical to the construction industry as it gives contractors and owners confidence in the findings, reduces disputes and project delays, and results in better decision-making. Laboratories owned by CCIL members, contractors, suppliers, consultants and government participate in and benefit from the certification programs.

CCIL certifies asphalt, aggregate and concrete testing laboratories and technicians. It is the largest laboratory certification company in Canada and the only one that provides certification programs for highway construction materials.

In B.C., these programs have been a tremendous success with a total of 66 laboratories and 588 technicians certified to date.

The awards were presented at the Fall Conference of the B.C. Road Builders & Heavy Construction Association held in Kelowna. Jack Davidson, President, accepted on behalf of the association. Todd Strynadka, Technical Services Manager at Terus Construction Ltd., was present to accept his award.
